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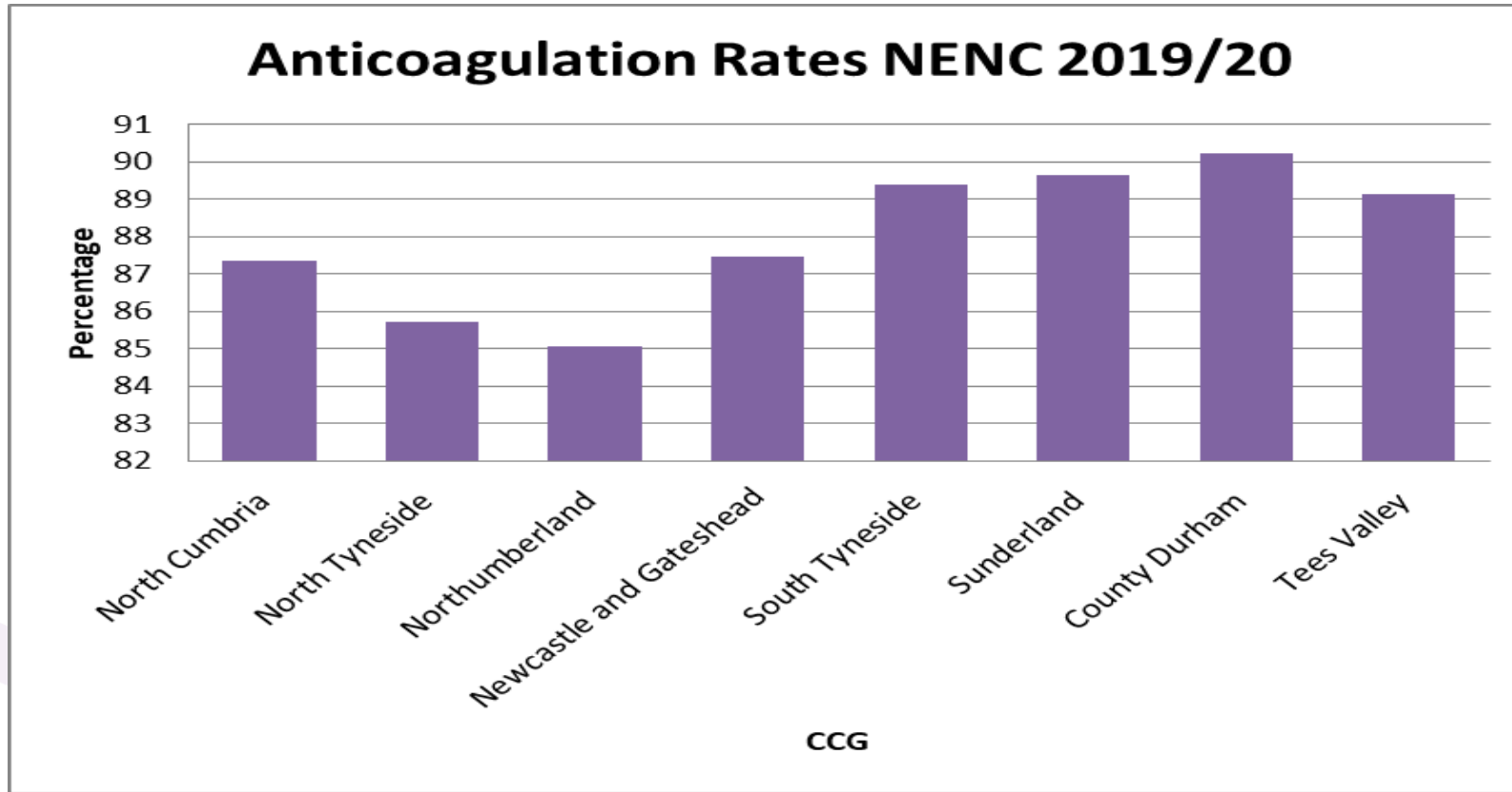
Where are we now?

- National AF Programme – ended 31st March 2020.

AF Prevalence

- QOF 2019/20 is **2.34%**
- QOF 2018/19 is **2.25%**
- There has been an increase in the AF register size of **3,105** patients (from 70,022 patients in 2018/19 to 73,127 patients in 2019/20).

Where are we now?



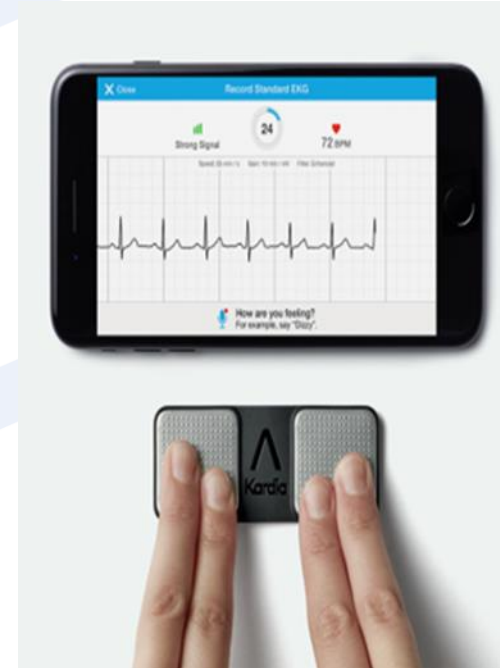
- Average NENC – 88.20%

Detection – next 3 years

AliveCor: impact across NENC

- 470 Lead 1 devices
- April 2018 – June 2020
 - 50,546 traces taken
 - 3,408 possible AF detected
 - 170+ strokes saved
 - Over £7.8M cost saved

Detection – next 3 years

- AF Diabetes Podiatry

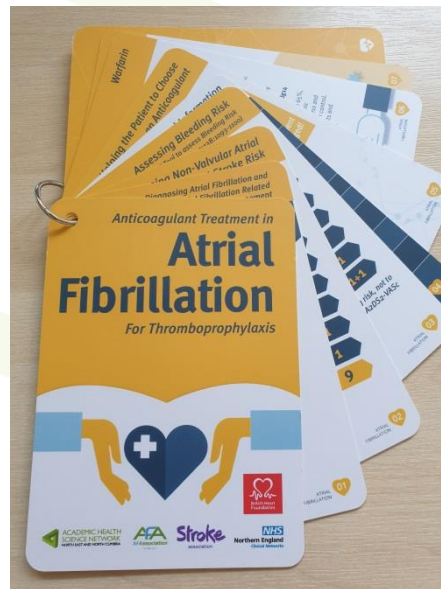


- For every footcheck 1 new patient found with AF – pilot work in County Durham and Darlington.
- Supported by College of Podiatry & NHSE/I Clinical Networks for Diabetes Footcare.
- Won AFA Healthcare Pioneers Award in 2018.
- Shortlisted for Advancing Healthcare Awards 2020 in the Faculty of Public Health and PHE award for contributions to PH.
