
Yorkshire and Humber Quarterly Network Overview


Criteria: 1st Episode Admitted During Period <34 Weeks Gestation

Health Data Research Innovation Gateway

The HDR Innovation Gateway (The Gateway) is the UK's unified portal to discover and request access to health datasets.

The Gateway provides a search engine and platform to discover, manage, enhance and request access to health datasets, tools and resources for vital research.

- Data Use Register shows how, by whom and why data have been reused

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Data discovery - list and explore datasets with standardised metadata


Cohort Discovery tool – remote secure query across multiple datasets to find groups of patients with specific characteristics

Collections – curated, centralised lists of resources available within the Gateway for ease of use

Data Access Request Management – manage and standardise responses to data access requests in a way that keeps people, projects, settings, data and outputs safe


Quality Improvement

Data recorded as part of clinical care contributes to local, regional and national audits, service evaluation and benchmarking as well as commissioning and research, to inform improvements in neonatal care and service organisation/delivery.

Establishing capability and capacity for quality improvement requires:

- Adequate resource (including time)
- Trained in improvement science methodology which includes:
- Quality planning,
- Defining the problem,
- Developing a shared purpose,
- Planning and implementing changes,
- Test and measuring improvement,
- Implementing, embedding and sustaining change.

15 steps for maternity toolkit inspired by the comment:

"I can tell what kind of care my daughter is going to get within 15 steps of walking on to the ward"

This comment highlights how important it is to understand what good quality care looks and feels like from the perspective of the people who experience that care. The toolkit aim is to explore different healthcare settings through the eyes of those who use them and their relatives/carers.

15 Steps small teams can be created by utilising the local Maternity Voices Partnership to provide service user/user rep, plus a partner, family member, along with clinical representation from midwifery & obstetrics, commissioner or Trust Board member. The small teams access local maternity settings where care is provided to get a 'feel' for the space, using all their senses to reflect on their first impressions and consider the impact of this experience. The small teams use the 15 Steps for Maternity Observation Guides ensuring their observations are considerate of a wide variety of service users who access local maternity care, with special care taken to consider the needs of seldom heard voices and minority groups.

15 Steps

Briefing – Participants gather in a room for a short briefing to hear where the 15 steps will take place

Provide a verbal report of findings to the MNVP meeting. Include positive aspect to celebrate & areas for improvement

Welcoming & informative; Safe & clean; friendly & personal; organised & calm

Small teams of 3 people gather to review areas in which you currently do not work

Findings – consider any positive aspects you would like to share immediately


National - PCSP

PCSP

All women have a plan for their maternity care, but personalised care and support planning goes much further. PCSP - a series of facilitated conversations in which the person actively participates to explore the management of their health and wellbeing within the context of their whole life and family situation so that all considerations that may impact on safe care are accounted for. It is developed - following an initial holistic assessment of a woman's health and wellbeing needs. The woman works together with her healthcare professionals to complete this assessment. The agreed personalised care and support plan should set out the decisions she makes about the care and support she wants to receive, taking into account the information above.
